SUMMARY

Attached is a briefing paper to members on operational police incidents of note and police/community initiatives carried out within Gwent Police during the months of July and August 2009. The report is divided into the five Local Policing Units (LPUs), Response, Operational Support and Crime Investigation service areas.

BACKGROUND

- 1.1 This paper is provided to present Members with an overview of operations and incidents that Gwent Police Officers and Staff have dealt with during the months of July and August 2009.
- 1.2 These incidents are selected from the full list of incidents and proactive operations stored within the Force Command and Control System (ORIS) and within Divisional/Departmental Databases.
- 1.3 During the months of July and August 2009 the Command and Control System recorded 47,199 incidents. Numerous other non-incident based operations and initiatives were also undertaken.
